An Endangered Species

Help is needed to save one of the few remaining airworthy Boeing C-97 Transports from extinction. Utilized during the last months of the Berlin Airlift, the Boeing C-97 began a long career as the "Unsung Hero" of the Cold War as a cargo transport and air refueler tanker.

The Berlin Airlift Historical Foundation has taken the challenge to preserve an airworthy Boeing C-97 and to use the aircraft to present the Cold War History beginning with the great Berlin Airlift in 1948 to the removal of the Berlin Wall in 1989. This history will be presented on information display panels mounted inside the fuselage.

On April 22nd, 1996, the Berlin Airlift Historical Foundation entered into a purchase agreement with Grace Aire, Inc. to acquire Boeing C-97G, N117GA, Serial Number 52-2718. As a tax exempt, 50(c)(3), nonprofit organization, the Foundation is in need of resources to help fund this One-Of-A-Kind project.
